


The first Library Committee chairman

Sir Hugh Edward Poynter (1882–1966, 3rd Baronet), from New South Wales, held office in 1946 before returning to England.


(Sir Hugh was the Commandery's second Director of Ceremonies).

The fourth Priory Librarian




Dr Trevor Claude James (1903–1983), from Tasmania, was Priory Librarian 1963-1975.

The sixth Priory Librarian




Dr Brian James Fotheringham (1941–), from South Australia, was Priory Librarian 1990-2003, the second longest period in office.

He was the last of the Library Committee chairmen.

The seventh Priory Librarian

Dr Ian James Howie-Willis (1937–), from the Australian Capital Territory, was Priory Librarian 2003-2012.

He had earlier been the Deputy Priory Librarian for 20 years. He was the first professional historian to be Librarian.
